Why do we ask for financial documentation?

Students who receive scholarships from the National Science Foundation S-STEM grant must provide documentation of a student's eligibility for the program and implement the grant regulations that students must be from a low-income household.

Why send your parent's tax information?

Parent tax transcript and signature(s) are needed if the student can still be claimed as a dependent according to Federal Financial Aid law. A student is ONLY CONSIDERED INDEPENDENT according to Federal Financial Aid if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Is 24 years old or older by December 31 of the award year;
- Is married;
- Has legal dependent(s), other than their spouse;
- Is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States;
- Is an orphan or ward of the State of Arizona or a ward of his/her residential State;
- Has received a dependency override through the University of Arizona's Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid (OSFA).

What forms of financial verification are accepted?

The information we require is the <u>number of exemptions</u> on the tax transcript and the amount of <u>TAXABLE</u> income. In accordance with federal guidelines, **complete** <u>ONE</u> of the following options for financial verification:
